


Instructor Biography



Carrie Hull

CFP-A Founder An Oregon native, Carrie Hull began her career as a law enforcement officer after graduating from the Oregon Department of Public Safety, Standards and Training and the Portland Police Bureau advanced academy. Currently, Carrie Hull is the Executive Director for the You Have Options Program, the Director of Certification for Certified FETI and operates her private consulting firm Carrie Hull Consulting where she primarily focuses on working directly with specialized units within law enforcement agencies around the globe and providing customized interviewing services to corporations, institutions of higher learning and government agencies.

Formerly, Carrie Hull was a detective with the Ashland Police Department, an instructor with the Oregon Sexual Assault Training Institute where she taught best practices in sexual assault investigations to law enforcement officers across the nation, served as a member of the Legislative and Public Policy Committee for the Oregon Sexual Assault Task Force, and was a Senior Associate with Margolis Healy in addition to serving as faculty for the National Center for Campus Public Safety (NCCPS) instructing at their Trauma-Informed Sexual Assault Investigation and Adjudication Educational Program.

In 2013, while working as a detective for the Ashland Police Department in Oregon, Carrie Hull formalized her approach to sexual assault reporting and investigations by founding the You Have Options Program, a national law enforcement program that provides reporting options for survivors of sexual violence. During the You Have Options Program development Carrie Hull created the Inquiry into Serial Sexual Assault (ISSA), the 20 Elements of a Victim-Centered and Offender-Focused Law Enforcement Response and the national law enforcement website www.ReportingOptions.org that is still operating today.

In 2015, the You Have Options Program received the Innovations in Criminal Justice Award from the Association of Prosecuting Attorney's (APA) and was a finalist for the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) Webber Seavey Award that recognizes law enforcement agencies for promoting a standard of excellence that exemplifies law enforcement's contribution and dedication to the quality of life in local communities.

During the development of the You Have Options Program, Carrie Hull identified a need for trauma-informed interview training that led her to working with FETI cofounders Lori Heitman and Russell Strand. In 2015, Carrie Hull created the first official FETI training course entitled Introduction to FETI which has continued to be taught to national and international attendees to this day. With the continued support of Lori Heitman and Russell Strand, Carrie Hull went on to create and facilitate all official FETI

training courses, including the Practical Application of FETI course where she is the lead instructor.

In 2017, Carrie Hull founded Veracities Public Benefit Corporation and acquired all intellectual property for the Forensic Experiential Trauma Interview from Lori Heitman and Russell Strand. Carrie Hull then founded the Certified FETI Program where she formalized and advanced the FETI Methodology by creating the curriculum for the FETI Framework, FETI Metrics and FETI Certification and the online learning portal CertifiedFETI.com. Both the Certified FETI Program and the You Have Options Program continue to be led by Carrie Hull and are operationally supported by Veracities Public Benefit Corporation.

Carrie Hull frequently conducts trainings for a variety of audiences including law enforcement officers and managers, prosecutors, judges, advocates, campus administrators and mental health professionals on the FETI Methodology, the You Have Options Program, issues of sexual assault, the identification of serial sexual predators, sexual assault dynamics, strengthening the law enforcement response to sexual violence, non-stranger sexual assault investigations and coordinated community response.

Carrie Hull has been given the opportunity to present and train for various organizations including the Battered Women's Justice Project (BWJP), End Violence Against Women International (EVAWI), the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), the United States Army and the National Crime Victims Law Institute (NCVLI) in addition to instructing at the Oregon Department of Public Safety, Standards and Training and for the Reserve Officer Law Enforcement Academy.

Carrie Hull is the founder of the Southern Oregon Sexual Assault Symposium, has coordinated and managed numerous community education presentations in relation to gender violence and co-authored "You Have Options: Improving Law Enforcement's Response to Sexual Assault," in the December 2014 issue of Police Chief Magazine. She has participated in roundtable discussions facilitated by U.S. Senator Claire McCaskill regarding campus sexual assault, was featured as a subject matter expert in "Pursuit of Truth: Adult Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse Seeking Justice" and testified in the Oregon Legislature regarding and in support of sexual assault protective orders and advocate privilege.

Carrie Hull relies on her years of experience directly working with survivors of sexual violence, in addition to other victims of trauma, to inform and enhance her passion for improving the criminal justice response to victims of violence. As Executive Director

for the You Have Options Program, she continues to work with community partners to provide training, technical assistance and policy development to law enforcement professionals seeking to improve their agency's response to sexual violence.

During her tenure as a law enforcement officer Carrie Hull has been a forensic interviewer of children, a participating member of the Jackson County Major Assault and Death Investigation Unit (MADIU) as well as the Jackson County Sexual Assault Response Team (JC SART) and the Jackson County Child Abuse Multi-Disciplinary Team and obtained instructor certification in Verbal Defense and Influence.

Carrie Hull has received the End Violence Against Women International Professional Impact Award for work that has significantly influenced response to violence against women, the National Crime Victim Law Institute's (NCVLI) Victims' Rights Partnership Award and the American Association of University Women (AAUW) Breaking Barriers Achievement Award, the local and regional Ruby Award from Soroptimist International and has been the recipient of three community-policing awards and two merit awards in addition to being named Officer of the Year at the Ashland Police Department.
